Opening Hymn

Confession and Absolution
God is love and we are his children.

God our Father, we confess to you and to our fellow members in the Body of Christ that we have sinned in thought, word and deed, and in what we have failed to do.


We are truly sorry.

Affirmation of Faith

(Please stand.)

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in God the Son?

I believe in Jesus Christ,
God's only Son, our Lord,
who was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit
and born of the Virgin Mary,
suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died and was buried;
he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

OPENING PRAYER


celebrating the work of God, Father, Son and Spirit, in creating, restoring and bringing to completion, all that is His.

Father, you never forget us or turn away from us, even when we fail you.

You sent your Son Jesus who gave his life for us.

He healed those who were sick, cared for those who were poor, and cried with those who were sad.

CHRISTOLOGICAL PRAYER

Thanksgiving to God for all that was accomplished in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. He forgave sinners and taught us to forgive. For all your love we give you thanks in the way that Jesus showed us.

On the night before he died, while he was having supper with his friends, he took bread and offered you thanks. He broke the bread, and gave it to them, saying: "Take, eat. This is my Body: it is broken for you."

After supper, he took the cup, he offered you thanks, and gave it to them saying: "Drink this, all of you. This is my Blood of the new covenant; it is poured out for you, and for all, that sins may be forgiven.

Do this in remembrance of me."

So, as we do what he told us, we open our hearts to him; we remember how he died and rose again to live now in us.

Together with him we offer you these gifts: in them we give you ourselves.

Send your Holy Spirit on us and on this bread and this wine, that they may be the Body and Blood of Christ, and that, sharing your life, we may travel in your company to our journey's end.
With all your people we give you thanks and praise through the Son and in the Spirit,

Breaking of the Bread


The living bread is broken for the life of the world. Lord, unite us in this sign.

The gifts of God for the people of God. All is now ready.

The Priest will receive the Bread and Wine.



The congregation will receive Communion, which will be given as a bread wafer, intincted with wine.

Please remain seated - the Eucharist Minister(s) will bring the Bread to your seat. Then, if you are able, as they approach please stand and move to the end of the pew to receive Communion.

If you wish to receive a **Gluten-free wafer**, please let the Minister know when they offer you Communion, and please ensure you consume a square wafer.

If you would like a Blessing please ask for one, and if you prefer not to receive, please just remain seated.

Communion

At the giving of the Bread:

The Body and Blood of Christ given for you.

The Communicant replies:

Amen.

THANKSGIVING AND SENDING OUT

Sentence

Give thanks to the Lord, for he is gracious.

And his mercy endures for ever.

Post Communion Prayer

The Priest prays the Post Communion Prayer and all respond: **Amen.**

Prayer of Thanksgiving

Father, your steadfast purpose is the completion of all things in your Son.

May we who have received the pledges of the kingdom, live by faith, walk in hope and be renewed in love, until the world reflects your glory and you are all in all; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.
